

The administration also encourages open communication and sharing of information.

In order for our children to have a safe and enjoyable experience on social media, it is important for them to follow a few common-sense rules.

Ten Tips When Online: a guide for students, parents, and staff

- 1. Talk to children regularly about how to use technology safely.
- 2. Make sure children meet the minimum age requirement before using social media.
 - Most major social media sites such as TikTok, Snapchat, Twitter, etc., have a minimum age restriction of 13 years old.
- 3. Control who sees children's posts through selecting appropriate privacy settings.
- 4. Guide children to exercise safe online behavior through:
 - Thinking twice before posting or sharing since it remains for life.
 - Drawing the line about what is and is not appropriate to share.
 - Agreeing what can be shared about themselves, their family, and their environment.
 - Knowing not to share phone numbers, home addresses, or E-mail addresses.
 - Respecting others online, and not posting embarrassing pictures or comments about other people or their posts.
 - Asking out of courtesy before posting a photo of other people if you may share their photograph.
- 5. Remind children not to interact inappropriately with people they do not know and never to meet online "friends" in the real world unless accompanied by an adult.

- 6. Share with children how to deal with cyberbullying by:
 - not responding
 - keeping a copy of all the messages
 - reporting it to the school or website
 - informing the police if the message includes threats or dangerous/harmful content

Let children know that most social media sites provide the ability to detach themselves from unwanted connections by:

- Unfriending/un-following someone: You can remove a connection to a friend who you are no longer comfortable sharing with. If you decide that you'd like to be friends later, you can send them a friend request or follow them.
- Blocking someone: If you are being harassed by someone online or if you just don't want to be
 visible to them, you can block them from your timeline. When you block someone, it breaks all
 ties you have with them.
- Reporting abusive or offensive content: The most efficient way to report abuse is to do it as soon as it occurs by using the "Report" option on the post, timeline page, or the offender's profile page. Reports are confidential. People you report won't know that they've been reported.

Remind children that you are there to support them: "You know you can tell me if you ever have a problem at school or online."

- 7. Respect family boundaries and establish trust when friending each other online.
- 8. Remind children to protect their accounts through security settings, particularly through changing passwords periodically and never sharing their passwords with others.
- 9. Avoid clicking on unfamiliar adds, suspicious links appearing on social media or through email. 10.Use a child-safe search engine and internet content filters like Google's Safe Search to change browser settings to prevent adult content from appearing in search results.
